

-Men's Retreat April 28-30, 2023

From the pen of our Retreat Master, Fr. Skip Thompson

Our Men's retreat was a deep dive into themes that have been on my heart for some time. "Pursuing a Masculine Spirituality" challenges men to understand their key masculine trait is to become a "living sacrifice" for their wives and children. Men have one mission: "Get their family to heaven." To this end, our first priority must be Christ. Because only through Christ can we overcome our primary obstacles: ignorance and fear. We offered 2 Masses, overnight Eucharistic adoration, Confession and 5 conferences for reconnaissance, understanding of Christ's mission, St. Joseph's example of courage and identified spiritual assets and allies in our fight for souls. I pray we can continue to bring this to men.
